# Who qualifies for the Severe Disability Premium?

A Severe Disability Premium can be included in an award of: Pension Credit, Income-Related ESA, Income Support, Income-Based JSA or Housing Benefit. The eligibility criteria are follows:

#### Single person

- No non-dependant aged 18 or over is normally residing with the claimant / the claimant is not the non-dependant of someone else, and
- They receive a qualifying disability benefit (see below), and
- No-one gets <u>paid</u> Carers Allowance or has a Carer Element in their UC award for looking after them.



#### **Couple, single rate** - is paid where one member of the couple qualifies:

- No non-dependant aged 18 or over is normally residing with them / they are not the non-dependants of someone else, **and**
- One of them gets a qualifying disability benefit (see below) and no-one gets <u>paid</u> Carers Allowance or has
   Carer Element in the UC award for looking after this member of the couple, and the <u>other is certified as severely sight impaired or blind</u>. Or
- <u>Both</u> get a qualifying disability benefit (see below) but Carers Allowance is being <u>paid</u> or has a Carer Element in the UC award for looking after <u>just one</u> of them.

## **Couple, couple rate** - is paid where both members qualify:

- No non-dependant aged 18 or over is normally residing with them / they are not the non-dependants of someone else, and
- <u>Both</u> get a qualifying disability benefit (see below), and
- No-one gets <u>paid</u> Carers Allowance or has a Carer Element in their UC award for looking after either of them.



### **Qualifying disability benefits for Severe Disability Premium**

- Attendance Allowance
- Daily Living Component of Personal Independence Payment (PIP) /Adult Disability Payment (ADP)
- Middle or High Rate Care Component of Disability Living Allowance /Child Disability Payment
- Armed Forces Independence Payment (AFIP)
- Constant Attendance Allowance or Exceptionally Severe Disablement Allowance paid with Industrial Injuries Disablement Benefit or War Pension Benefit or War Pension (can be paid to working age claimants).

## Non-dependants do NOT include:

- those that get a qualifying disability benefit (see above) themselves, or
- those who are certified as severely sight impaired or blind, or
- Lodgers, boarders, joint tenants^, or other tenants who are separately liable for the rent.
  - ^ For PC, IR-ESA, IS and IB-JSA this can only be a close relative if the joint tenancy started before 11<sup>th</sup> April 1988, or if later, on or before the date on which the claimant (or claimant's partner) first occupied the property.
  - NOTE: Where moved in to care for the claimant (and they have never lived with them before) then not classed as a non-dependant for first 12 weeks.
